Motorcyclist stops in Fargo on benefit ride

Doug Oakley, a 46-year-old financial services professional who was recently diagnosed with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease, is undertaking a "4 Corners Motorcycle Ride" to the four corners of the U.S. to raise funds and awareness for the care of patients with ALS.

Doug Oakley, a 46-year-old financial services professional who was recently diagnosed with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease, is undertaking a "4 Corners Motorcycle Ride" to the four corners of the U.S. to raise funds and awareness for the care of patients with ALS.

Oakley stopped in Fargo on Tuesday before heading toward the fourth corner of his trip in Machias, Mass.

Oakley is riding to raise money for a Cape Cod, Mass.-based nonprofit organization, Compassionate Care ALS, which cares for ALS patients. The organization will receive all donations, according to a news release.

During his ride, Oakley and a friend will drive around the perimeter of the United States, stopping at the corners of the country: Key West, Fla.; San Luis Obispo, Calif.; Blaine, Wash.; and Machias. They began the 8,300-mile long ride at the first corner in Key West on May 14.
